ORDER

This matter having come before the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH) upon the application of Pat Catanzareti for an Order establishing a joint review process between COAH and the Department of Environmental Protection regarding review of sewer connection bans and low and moderate income housing; or alternatively, for an Order giving Pat Catanzareti's property priority when sewerage becomes available, with Edward J. Boccher, Esq. of Steinberg & Boccher, Esqs., appearing on behalf of Pat Catanzareti; and Richard P. Cushing, Esq. of Gebhardt & Kiefer, Esqs., appearing on behalf of the Town of Clinton; and Peter A. Buchsbaum, Esq. of Hannotch Weisman, Esqs., appearing on behalf of the Borough of High Bridge; and Harley A. Williams, Deputy Attorney General, appearing on behalf of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; and COAH having considered all papers filed by the various parties and for the reasons set forth in COAH's written Opinion of even date, and for further good cause shown;

IT IS on this 5th day of June, 1989

ORDERED that Pat Catanzareti's motion to seek an exemption from the sewer connection ban imposed upon the Town of Clinton's Sewerage Treatment Plant is hereby denied; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Pat Catanzareti's motion to be given priority when sewerage capacity does become available, is hereby granted with the understanding that any priority shall be given consistent with COAH's Opinion of even date.
