

EXECUTIVE ORDERS

the Board; and may adopt By-laws and rules governing their work consistent with law.

(c) Within the limits of appropriations made available to it, the Board is hereby authorized to employ such staff as may be necessary to carry out the duties assigned to it.

(d) The Council shall be entitled to call upon any department, agency or office of the State of New Jersey for such documents, materials and information as it may deem necessary, and shall be entitled to the cooperation of every department, agency, and office of the State of New Jersey.

6. This Executive Order shall take effect immediately.
