EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 41

WHEREAS, The people of the United States and of all the World have suffered a grievous loss in the death of former President Harry S. Truman, and

WHEREAS, December 28, 1972 has been set aside as a National Day of Mourning for the late former President, and

WHEREAS, It is fitting and proper that this day be set aside as a day of mourning and prayer in memory of this great man,

Now, THEREFORE, I, William T. Cahill, Governor of the State of New Jersey, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and by the statutes of this State, do hereby ORDER and DIRECT that Thursday, December 28, 1972 shall be a day of mourning and prayer for our late former President Harry S. Truman and further ORDER and DIRECT that:

1. All State offices and buildings shall be closed, work permitting, for the transaction of the regular business of government from and after 12 o'clock noon and State employees shall be excused at that time to pay their private respects to President Truman.

2. This Executive Order is not intended to affect banks, schools, county and local governments and the transaction of other business.
